### IV. Chair's Time [Moved ahead due to the visit of Brentsville District Representative Gil Trenum]

Brentsville District School Board Member Gil Trenum was invited by the Council in order to discuss the current state of Prince William County. He focused primarily on the following topics:

- A. **Budget concerns:** It appears that the 2% increase in teacher's salary will be able to be sustained even though there continues to be deep budget concerns. He continues to be concerned about the amount of taxes sent by the Northern Virginia area to the capital and the return to the Northern Virginia region.
- B. Class sizes: Due to budget constrains class sizes will continue to be at higher-levels than desired.
- C. **Boundary Adjustments:** Given new construction boundary changes are on the forefront. In addition, with the building of the new K-8 Nokesville school, some TCWES students may be diverted to the new school.<sup>1</sup>
- D. **County Computer Updates:** By 2014 area schools are working to upgrade computer systems to Windows 2007 given the license expiration of Windows XP. These software changes will result in high costs to area schools.
- E. **New High School:** The Council discussed the pending construction of a new area high school on the eastern end of Prince William County. There was a discussion about the new school projected to have a swimming pool—which appears to be an area need.
